Record number of entries received

This year's winners will be recognised at the Young Guns 15 awards ceremony and party on 16 November 2017 at Highline Stages in New York's Meatpacking District. The evening will be hosted by legendary designer James Victore, a Young Guns winner from the program's inaugural class of 1996. Tickets are available [here](#).
