
De Lange says, ""I'mnot great at selfies but look, I have a t-shirt from Rob van Vuuren's 'What What' show."

1. Where do you live, work and play?


I live in Vredehoek, Cape Town; I work across the country, and I play in my flat.




5. What do you love about your industry?

It's unpredictable and forces you to be on your toes and constantly adapt. If you're not fresh, you don't survive, and that makes for good motivation.

6. Describe your average workday, if such a thing exists.

I wake up at 4:45am and eat two bananas. By 5:30am, I'm at work getting ready for breakfast radio, which runs till 9am. Then I prepare for the next day's show and head home at 1:30pm, where I take a nap or I go to the gym, or take care of anything that needs to happen in my life.





After Tve rested T nead out at hight to gigs in Cape Town to get some stage time in and keep writing, because the only way to really write stand-up is to be on stage. I get to bed at about 11pm and the cycle starts again.

7. What are the tools of your trade?

Books, news, studios, cables, microphones, and an open mind.

8. Who is getting it right in your industry?

The South African comedy industry is doing great things and the world is starting to notice. At the moment I'd say Conrad Koch, Loyiso Gola, Loyiso Madinga, Tumi Morake, Carvin Goldstone, and Riaad Moosa come to mind.



When it comes to radio, I'm a big fan of broadcasters who move towards podcasting. It's part of the future and it's great to see so many of them popping up.

9. List a few pain points the industry can improve on.

I definitely think that comedy can improve by working towards making it more sustainable for performers. It's a difficult industry to get into and even more difficult to stay in the industry to a point that you make it a reliable livelihood.

I think radio can improve with more reliable and trustworthy methods of measuring audience numbers. At the moment, there are different ways of collecting the numbers and different opinions on what the most effective ones are.

10. What are you working on right now?

I'm working on doing my one-man show, *The Phil Spectrum*, which is happening at the Baxter Theatre on Friday, 22 March.



11. Tell us some of the buzzwords floating around in your industry at the moment, and some of the catchphrases you utter yourself.


"Killing it," and "dying" - two phrases that won't make sense to someone who won't know it means to do well or do badly.

14. Are you a technophobe or a technophile?


I don't know why anyone would be scared of technology. It's fantastic.
